## Whitehall, September 22.

Whitehall, September 22. As feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of thele Kingdoms, the follow-ing Aufracts of Acts of Parliament of Their late Majesties King George the First and Second, and of His present Majesty, for preventing such Practices, are published, for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them: And it will be observed, that such Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or infirumental in the Sending or Enticing Artifacers or Manufacturers out of thele. or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Inftruments used by them, as well as to the Artifi-cers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brass, or other- Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and fhalf be convicted thereof, upon Indictment or Informa-tion in any of the Courts at Weltminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter Sefficies, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-fon having been once convicted shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Diferetion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artificers, shall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Bealer within Six Months and Washington to Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambaffador, Minifter or Conful of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Perfon authorifed by fuch Ambailador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfons hall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, Devile, or Purchafe, and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, Sc. within this Kingdom, to His Majesty's
