At the General Session of the Peace of our Lord the King, holden for the City of London, at the Guildhall within the said City, on Monday the 10th Day of September, in the Thirty-eighth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord George the Third, King of Great Britain, &c. before Sir John William Anderson, Baronet, Mayor of the City of London, Sir John William Rose, Knight, Serjeant at Law, Recorder of the said City, Sir Richard Carr Glyn, Knight, William Lushington, Esq; Charles Price, Esq; George Hibbert, Esq; Aldermen of the said City, and others their Fellows, Justices of our said Lord the King, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lord the King within the said City; and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespases and other Misdemeanors committed within the said City;
