Navy-Office, October 13, 1798.

THE Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea Officers from the 1st January to the 30th June, 1798, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf: These are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days:

On Monday the 22d Instant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 23d and Wednesday the 24th Instant, to Lieutenants and their Attornies:

And on Thursday the 25th Instant, to Masters and Surgeons.

After which the List will be recalled the First and Third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave before their Half-Pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or War-

rant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence in the Manner pointed out by the said Act." Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending 30th June, 1798, will commence paying on the 22d Instant; and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above directed.
