minions, and none other, and that a Certificate shall be produced, within Six Months from the Date of the Bond, if fuch Rock Salt shall be entered out for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in Europe; and within Twelve Months, if for any Part of His Majesty's Dominions in America or the West Indies; and within Eighteen Months, if for any of the British Settlements or Factories in Asia or Africa, under the Hand of the Principal Officer of the Customs at the Port or Place where such Rock Salt shall be so landed; and if there shall be no Officer of the Customs, then under the Hand of the Chief Magistrate of the Place, testifying that the said Rock Salt has been duly landed at the Port or Place for which the fame was entered out .-- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THEREAS by an Order in Council dated the Twenty-ninch of August, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-eight, His Majesty was pleased to declare, that the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and those of the Territory of the Pope, should be considered as in a State of Hostility with His Majesty, and to require all His Majesty's Subjects, and others, to treat and confider the Inhabitants and Subjects thereof as His Majesty's Enemies: His Majesty, being determined to take such further Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Honor of His Crown, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that General Reprifals be granted against the Ships and Goods belonging to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themfelves the Ligurian and the Roman Republicks, fo that as well His Majesty's Fleet and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commisfionated by Letters of Marque, or General Reprifals, or otherwise, by His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships, Veffels, and Goods, belonging to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pre-tended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themselves the Ligurian and the Roman Republicks, and bring the same to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions; and to that End, His Majesty's Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at Commission, and present the same to His Majesty at derstanding, but that, on the contrary, until this Board, authorising the Commissioners for execut. Period, the Sublime Porte has made it her uniform

ing the Office of Lord High Admiral, or any Person or Persons by them empowered and appointed, to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Reprifals to any of His Majesty's Subjects, or others, whom the said Commissioners shall deem fitly qualified in that Behalf, for the apprehending, feizing, and taking the Ships, Vessels, and Goods belonging to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themselves the Ligurian and Roman Republicks; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents: And His Majesty's said Advocate-General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to His Majesty, at this Board, authorifing the faid Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to will and require the High Court of Admiralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, his Surrogate or Surrogates, as also the feveral Courts of Admiralty within His Majesty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and judicially proceed upon all, and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprifals, of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same; and according to the Course of Admiralty, and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels, and Goods, as shall belong to the Persons inhabiting the Coasts and Ports of Genoa, and the Territories of the Pope, now subject to the pretended Authority of Governments constituted by the Power of His Majesty's Enemies, styling themselves the Ligurian and the Roman Republicks; and that such Powers and Claufes be inferted in the faid Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents. And they are likewise to prepare and lay before His Majesty, at this Board, a Draught of such Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Governments and Plantations, for their Guidance herein; as also another Draught of Instructions for such Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purposes aforementioned.
