A Chief undulated Argent, thereon Waves of the Sea, from which a Palm Tree iffuant, between a difabled Ship, on the Dexter, and a ruinous Battery, on the Sinifler, all Proper; and for his Creft, on a Naval Crown Or, The Chelengk, or Plume of Triumph, prefented to him by the Grand Signior, as a Mark his high Efteem, and of his Senfe of the gallant Conduct of the faid Horatio Baron Nelfon in the faid glorious and decifive Victory ; with the Motto, "PALMAM QUI MERUIT FERAT ;" and to his Supporters, being a Sailor, on the Dexter, and a Lion, on the Sinifter, the honorable Augmentations following, viz.
