The KING's Moft Excellent Majefty in Council. WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of June last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Twenty-fifth Day of this instant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty-fifth Day of this instant December, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or ship or lade any of the Articles above mentioned on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond

T the Court at St. James's, the 19th of De-1 had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year. of His Majefty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to ena-" ble His Majefty to reftrain the Exportation of Na-" val Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Ex-" portation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, " when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in " Council." But it is, neverthelefs, His Majefty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to any of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Veffels or Boats, in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on Board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ule of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courle of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majefty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies; provided that, upon the Exportation of any of the faid Articles, for the Purpofes of Trade, to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indics, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the fame to the Places for which they shall be entered the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first | Outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be
