HIGHWAY ROBBERY.

NOTICE is hereby given, (pursuant to an Act of Parliament, made in the Eighth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intitled, "An Act for the Amendment of the Law relating to the Statute of

Hugh and Cry.") that William Shenstone, of Chesterton, in County of Salop, Gentleman, on Friday the 22d Day of February now last past, between the Hours of Five and Six in the Afternoon of the same Day, was waylaid, shot through the Left Arm, and robbed by Two Persons in the Highway at Pirton, between Wolverhampton and Pattingham, in the Hundred of Sciflon, in the County of Stafford: One of them being rather a tall thin Man, thin Face, and having on a lightish coloured Coat, made Frock Fashion, quite plain, mounted on a Bay Hackney: He must have blooded his Cloaths in searching the Pockets, as Mr. Shenstone bled very much. The other, a middle-sized Man, broad set, high Cheek Bones, rather a wide Mouth, a little corpulent, and from Appearances it is concluded he has been more corpulent; and rode on a Bay Hackney, with a good Deal of White on its Face: Which Two Persons took from him the said William Shenstone, Eight Five-Guinea Notes, drawn by Hordern and Co. of the Wolverhampton-Bank, and Three One-Pound Notes of the Bank of England, and about Two Guineas and a Half in Gold and Silver, and then made off.
