wards Swifferland, and he himfelf, with the Remainder of his Army, towards Fribourg and Offen-

bourg, by the Black Forest.

Whilit this was passing in Suabia, General Mas-tsena in Person attacked, on the 23d, the Position of Feldkirk, where General Jellachich commanded in the Absence of General Hotzé. The French were repulsed with very great Loss, and driven over the Rhine. General Hotzé is since returned to Feld-kirk from Buckhorn, with the Corps of Twelve Thousand Men, which he had marched to that Place, the French having retreated from thence in confequence of the Archduke's Victory of the 21st.

The Loss on both Sides in these different Actions, which appear to have been hard fought, has been very confiderable, but much greater on the Part of the French than on that of the Austriaus, who have, however, lost several Officers of Distinction. On the 21st, the French are stated to have loft Four Thousand Men-on the 23d, Three Thousand-and on the 25th, their Lols is stated to have been much more confiderable than on either

of the preceding Days. .On the 26th, the Archduke marched in pur-

fuit of the Enemy.
