THIS Day His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the House of Peers, and being seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Bryan Connor, Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Excellency to the House of Commons, signifying His Pleasure that they should immediately attend His Excellency in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Excellency gave the Royal Assent to

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Rates and Duties on Dwelling-Houses inhabited, according to the Number of Windows or Lights therein respectively.

An Act for granting additional Duties on Beer, Ale, and Spirits, imported into this Kingdom.

An Act for granting to His Majesty the Duties therein mentioned, on the several Kinds of Paper therein mentioned, imported into and made in Ireland, and for amending and continuing an Act, passed last Session of Parliament, to secure the Collection of the Duties on Paper made in Ireland, and to prevent Frauds therein.

An Act for granting to His Majesty the Duties and additional Duties on the Licences therein-mentioned.

An Act for granting to His Majesty Duties on Licences to sell Spirituous Liquors and Metheglin, and for continuing the several Laws for regulating the issuing of Licences for the Sale of Wine, Ale, Beer, Cider, and Spirituous Liquors by Retail, and for preventing the immoderate Use of Spirituous Liquors.

An Act to enable the Commissioners of the Treasury in Ireland to receive from the Commissioners of the Treasury in England a Sum not exceeding the Sum therein mentioned, as a Loan, in Part of the Supply granted to His Majesty for the Service of the Year One thousand seven hundred and ninety-nine, and for securing the Interest and Charges
