SIR,

YOU will be pleased to acquaint their Lordships, that the following Merchant Vessels belonging to the Enemy have been captured by the Ships and Vessels of His Majesty's Squadron under my Command, as against their several Names expressed. By the Bittern—The Spanish Ship Amistad Letter of Marque, from Giejon in Spain, bound to La Guira, laden with Wine, Brandy, &c. By the Lapwing—Two French Schooners, La Revanche and L'Aimable, the former from Saint Thomas and the latter from Saint Bartholomew's, bound to Guadaloupe, laden with Dry Goods, Provisions, &c.
