**T**HE Commissioners appointed to carry into Execution an Act of Parliament passed in the Eleventh Year of His present Majesty's Reign, for consolidating, &c. the several Acts of Parliament for Paving, Cleansing, and Lighting the City of London and Liberties thereof, do hereby give Notice, That they will meet in the Council-Chamber of the Guildhall, on Tuesday the 3d Day of September next, at Five o'Clock in the Afternoon, to let, by Public Auction, a Lease for One Year from Michaelmas Day next, of the Tolls directed by the said Act to be paid before any Cattle or Carriage shall be permitted to pass on a Sunday through any or either of the Turnpikes hereafter mentioned, or through any Turnpike to be erected by virtue of the said Act, or any other Act or Acts of Parliament near the same, viz.

For every Coach, Chariot, Berlin, Chaise, Chair, Calash, or other Carriage, drawn by Four Horses or Mules, the Sum of Eight-pence.

For every Coach, Chariot, Berlin, Chaise, Chair, Calash, or other Carriage, drawn by Three or Two Horses or Mules, the Sum of Six-pence.

For every Chaise, Chair, Calash, or other Carriage, drawn by One Horse or Mule, the Sum of Three-pence: And for every Horse, Mule or Ass, not drawing, the Sum of One Penny.

Subject, nevertheless, to the Provision by the said Act, that Persons shall not be liable to the Payment of the said Tolls more than Once a Day for passing or repassing with the same Cattle and Carriage.
