P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every such Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or Officers employed on Shore for raising Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by his said Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the said Month of February, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers appointed to raise Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels in the Ports or on the Coasts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the said Proclamations for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant

August; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the said Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first Day of this instant August to the Thirty-first Day of October next inclusive:—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

S I R,

Herewith I transmit, for their Lordships' Information, a Letter from Captain Boorder, of His Majesty's Sloop *L'Espegle*, stating his Success in Company with the *Pylades*, in having cut out, burnt, and took Possession of the Vessels therein mentioned; and beg to recommend Captain Boorder to their Lordships' particular Notice for his Activity and Zeal for the Service, not only exemplified in this but other preceding Instances.

His Majesty's Sloop L'Espegle, Yarmouth-Roads, August 20, 1799.

S I R,

I Have to acquaint you of my Arrival at this Anchorage with His Majesty's Sloop under my Command, and of my having, in Company with

the Pylades Sloop and Courier Cutter, cut out and took Possession of, on the 11th Instant, from Shiermannickog, the Craft Gun Brig, (formerly in our Service,) mounting Twelve Guns, Eighteen, Twenty-four, and Thirty-two-Pounders; as also having burnt a Schooner of Seventy Men; likewise took Possession of a Row Boat, of Thirty Men: we then landed on the Island, (having previously drove the Men from the Battery,) spiked Four Pieces of Cannon, and brought off Two Brass Field Pieces, Four-Pounders.

The Craft made an obstinate Resistance from Forty to Fifty Minutes, and then struck.

I am happy to add not more than Two Men were killed on our Side, and Three Wounded, and recommend the Craft as an excellent Vessel well calculated for His Majesty's Service, being of a small Draught of Water. I cannot but express my Satisfaction on our keeping the Ships afloat, as in many Places our Soundings proved there to be not more than Fourteen Feet, the Espiegle drawing Twelve.
