Three Hundred and Fifty Rank and File of the 1st Battalion of the 35th Regiment cannot exactly be accounted for, from the Nature of the Action, and from the Regiment being sent immediately to the Helder in charge of Prisoners; but it is much feared that nearly One Hundred are killed, and the Remainder wounded and missing.

The Return of the Royal Artillery, received since the general Return was closed.

Five Gunners, Four Gunner Drivers, Three Additional Gunners, killed.

First Lieutenant Eligie wounded and taken Prisoner: Volunteer John Douglas wounded.

Eight Gunners, Six Gunner-Divers, Four Additional Gunners, wounded.

Seven Gunners, Nine Gunner-Divers, missing.
