And Malice, wherewith fome Men of a sedi-tious and Reffleis Spirit, do foread abroad a most falle and feandalous Report, of a Mar-riage, or Contract of Marriage, fuppoled to be had and made between Us, and one Mrs. Walters, alias Ba low, now deceafed, Mother of the pre-fact Duke of Marri ut aging thereby to fill the minds of

fent Duke of *Monm uib*, aiming thereby to fill the minds of Our Loving Subjects with Doubts and Fears, and if pollible, to divide them into Parties and Factions, and as much as in them hes, to bring into Queffion, the clear undoubted Right of Our True and Lawful Heirs, and Succeffors to the Crown. We have therefore thought Our Self obliged, to let Our Loving Subjects fee, what fteps, We (out of Our Care of them and their Pofterity) have already made, in order to obviate the ill Confequences, that fo dangerous and malici-ous a Report may have in future times, upon the Peace of Our Kingdoms:

In January laft was Twelvemonth, We made a Declarati-on, written with Our own Hand, in these Words following,

There being a faife and maincious Report, industricully foread abroad by fome, who are neither friends to Me, or the Dake of Monmouth, as if I fould have been eiter Contracted, or daof MORIMOUTIN, do if I poshid bave peen either Contrictico, or dda-ried to bis Mother; and though I am moft corfi (nt, iha: bis ide Story cannot have any effect in this Age, yet I shouge t in My Duty, in Relation to the true Specific in if his Criwn, and that faithf Ages may not have any p etence is give diffurbance up n that fore, or any other of this nature, to Dillor, as I do here Diclare, in the profence of Almighty God, Thit I never was Married, nor can any Control I and Way an while four the are the Specific and the second Herein Control I and Way and while four here is an My for gave any Couract to any Won an what fever, but to my Wife, Queen Catherine, to whom I can now Matrick. In Withers whoreof, I fit my Hand at Whitehall, the S xib of January, 1679.

To litengthen which Declaration, We did in March follow-ing (which was March latt was Twelvemonth) make a more publick Declaration in Our Privy Council, written like-wife with Our own Hand; and having caufed a true Tran-foript thereof, to be Entred in Our Council Books, We Sign-ed it, and caufed the Lords of Our Privy Council, then at-tending Us in Council, to fubficible the fame likewife, And We are dependent of the Lords of the Council Cheft where We ordered the Original to be kept in the Council Cheft, where it now remains. The Entry whereof in the Council Book, is in these words following.

At the Court at Wineball, March the 3d. 1679.

I Is Majefty was this day pleafed to Command, That the Declartion hereafter following, be entred in the Coun-cil Book, it being all Written, and Signed by His Majefties own Hand, in a Paper which His Majefty this day delivered at the Board, to be kept in the Counsil Cheft, viz.

For the Avoiding of any Diffute which may happ n in time to come, concerning the Saucefirm of the Come, idu be e De-clares in the prefence of Almighty Ge., This I never g un nor made any Contrast of Marinage, nor was Marred to any I emaa what seever, but to My prefint W fs 2 men. N April last We found the fame Rumour, not only revived again, but allo improved with new Additions, To wit, It was given out, That there was a Writing yet extant, and late-ly produced before feveral Perfons, whereby the faid Marri-age, or a Contract at leaft (for the Report was various) would appear, and that there are forward 1 ords, and cherry we be appear, and that there are feveral Lords, and others yet living, who were pretended to have been prefent at the faid Marriage We knew full well, that it was impossible, that any thing of this flould be true, (there being nothing more groundloss and taile, than that there was any fuch Marriage groundless and taile, than that there was any juch Marriage or Contract, between Us and the laid Mrs. Waites, alias Earlies) yet We proceeded to call before Us, and cauled to be interrogated in Council, fuch Lords, and other Perfons, as the common Runour did furmife to have been prefericate the pretended Marriage, or to know fomething of it, or off the faid Writing; And though it appeared to all Our Coun-cil, upon the hearing of the faid Lords and other Perfons, fe-verally Interrogated, and upon their denying to have been prefere at any fuch Marriage, or to know any thing of it, or of any fuch Writing, That the raifing and fpreading of fuch a Report, fo incoherent in the feveral parts of it, was the effect of deep Malice in fome few, and of loofe and idle Difcourie in others; Yet We think it requisite at this time, Difcourfe in others; Yet We think it requilite at this time, to make Our Declarations above recited, more publick; and to Order the fame (as We do hereby, with - Advice Privy Council) to be forthwith 1 rinted Our And We do again upon this occafion, call Al nefs and Declare upon the Faith of a d of a King, that there was never ah °•of Mariage, had, or made, between trs, alias Barlow, the Duke of M tween Us, and any Woman whatfoe, Queen Calbering, that now is, only k
