Copy of a Letter from Mr. George Buckley, Collector of the Customs at Newhaven, to Evan Nepean, Esq; dated the 4th Instant.

SIR,

I BEG Leave to inform you, that I Yesterday received Information that a small Vessel of a suspicious Appearance was lying near the Harbour, on which I immediately went to Mr. Bound, Mate of the Nox Cutter, who, with one of my Boatmen, and some of the Crew of the Nox, manned the Custom-House Boat, who, together with Mr. S. Cooper, Master of the Unity, of this Place, assisted by some of the Coast Artillery (which I command,) and other Persons who volunteered their Services on this Occasion, manned Four other Boats, and proceeded in Pursuit of her; when after a Chace of about Two Hours we came up with her, and after a short Resistance she struck and proved to be Le General Brune, of Dieppe, Burthen about Thirty Tons, commanded by Citizen Fleury, manned with Fifteen Men, and armed with Two Carriage Guns, not mounted, and a Quantity of small Arms. The Vessel and her Papers are in my Possession, and I have to observe that Mr. Bound, Mr. Cooper, and the whole of the Persons who volunteered their Services on this Occasion, deserve the greatest Credit.
