have no credit; However, it is certain, that his Electoral Highnefs is veryill; and that he has put the Administration of Affairs, into the hands of the Electoral Prince his Son. The King of Denmark, was expected as yefterday at Gluck statt; It is hoped that his coming into the fe parts, will give occasion to an Enterview, between him, and the Duke of Holftein Gottorp, and that the Effect of that will be, a composure of the Differences that are fill depending between them. Our Magistrates have ordered, that no perfon fhall be permitted to come into this City, without a Certificate of Health.

Amfterdam. July 5. We are informed that the French Ambaflador at the Hague, has prefented a Memorial to the Statcs-General, wherein he defires them not to have any jealoufic of the Journey which the Kinghis Mafter is now going to make, for that it is only to vifit his Conquells. We are likewife told, that the French have offer'd this Expedient in the matter of the Title of Duke of Burgundy, that they will be content the Spaniards fhall ufe it when they Treat with any other Princes, upon condition, they omit it in their Tranfactions with them. From Germany we have an account, that the French attack the Callle of Falkenberg.

Hague, fuly 5. The States of Holland meet again on Tuefday next, but will not fit above a fortnight, unlefs fomething extraordinary happen from abroad. Our laft Letters from Paris faid, that that King continued in the refolution, to poffefs himfe.f of what he pretends belongs to him in Flanders, as Dependencies of those places that were yielded to him by the Peace. The Heer Zitters, embarked for England on Wednefday laft with a fair Wind. The Prince and Princes are expected here about the middle of the next week.

Paris, Fune 2.9. The King will begin his journey for Flanders the 15th of the next month, and will, as is faid, be abroad till the middle of September. The Affembly of the Clergy is going to feparate, having granted the King the Three Millions he demanded, which was the main bufine is they were called together for. People continue to difcourfe varioully, concerning our differences with Rome, which according to all appearance, are not like to be specily determined.

Plymouth, June 25. On Tuesday sailed from hence the Assurance, Captain Akerman, and the Antelope, Capt. Story for Tangier; the next day lailed likewise the Dartmouth Frigat, Capt. Churchil, to cruise to the Westward, and the Greybound, Capt. Westminster, June 29. This day Richard Radley, who was the last Assistant in Effex, Convised of Speaking Scandalous words of the Lord Chief Fustice Scroggs, came to the Court of Kings Bench to receive his Fudgment, which was pronounced to be this; That be should stand by the Space of an boar, at all the Courts of Westminster-Hall, with a Paper on his Breast, signifying his Offence, that he should at the next Assist at Brentwood in Effex, stand in the open Market-place, by the space of two hours, with such a Paper on his Breast, that ke pay 200 L for a Fine to the King, and be imprisoned till be pay it, and that be find Survies for the good Bebaviour for three years.

Peps to the Tower, and no Evidence for an Indictment, having been offered in all this time against them, notwithstanding their repeated Demand of Tryal, in every of the faid Terms, and their giving Bail, in the sum of 60000 l. sterling, for their appearing to any Charge that should be brought against them, they were this day discharghed.

Sir John Gage, Mr. Roper, Mr. Heveningham; Mr. Howard. and others, were likewife dilcharged for non-Profecution; and Sir James Symonds, Mr. Dormer, Mr. Caryl, Sc. were Bailed.
