Attached to your Majesty by every Sentiment that can most endear a Sovereign to his People, who has long been held to be the Father of his People in the just and fullest Sense of the Word, we beg Leave to acknowledge with the highest Gratitude the merciful Interposition of Providence which has been manifested upon this Occasion; and fervently to pray that the Almighty may long continue to protect and continue a Life so truly valuable to all your Majesty's Subjects.
