

*Act of the Thirty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign :*  
**THE COMMISSIONERS THEREFORE DO HEREBY GIVE NOTICE,** That Proceedings will be had against all Persons who shall appear to have offended against the said Acts, to recover the Amount of the Duties payable under the said Acts respectively, together with the Penalties incurred by such Persons as shall appear not to have complied with the Terms of the said Acts. **AND THE COMMISSIONERS ALSO GIVE NOTICE,** That by the said Act of the Thirty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, all Persons paying and receiving Legacies or Personal Estate, subject to the said Duties, without receiving and allowing thereout respectively the Duties payable thereon, are chargeable with the said Duties as Debts due to His Majesty, and both Parties are respectively liable to Penalties, in case of Payment of such Legacies without such Receipt or Discharge as required by the Act.

**THE COMMISSIONERS ALSO GIVE NOTICE,** That by an Act passed in the Thirty-seventh Year of His Majesty's Reign, it is enacted, " That every Person who shall administer the Personal Estate of any Person dying after the passing of the said Act, or any Part thereof, without proving the Will of the Deceased, or taking out Letters of Administration of such Personal Estate within Six Calendar Months after the Death of the Person so dying, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of 50 l. to be recovered as therein is mentioned, one Moiety thereof to His Majesty, and the other to the Person who shall sue for the same." *By Order of the Commissioners,*
