The KING's Molt Excellent Majefty in Council. The KING's Molt Excellent Majelty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act paffed in the Twenty-fecond Year of His late Majefty King Charles the Second, intituled "An Additional Act for the "rebuilding of the City of London, uniting the "Parifhes, and rebuilding of the Cathedral and Pa-"rochial Churches within the faid City," taking Notice that great Exactions had been, and were exercised by Wharfingers and others employed about the Wharfage and Cranage of Goods landed or fhipped off at or from the faid City of London; for Remedy thereof it was enacted, that fuch Rates and no other fhould from Time to Time be taken and no other should from Time to Time be taken for Wharfage and Cranage, as well of Timber and other Materials for building, as of Coals and other Goods and Merchandizes, as by His faid Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, fhould for that Purpole be alleffed and allowed to be taken, a Table of which Rates flould be hanged up at every of the faid Wharfs refpectively; and if any Wharf-inger or other fhould exact or demand, 'or directly or indirectly take or receive for Wharfage or Cranage, or by Colour thereof more than according to the Rates which should be fo affeffed, or fhould refuse to fuffer any Goods or Merchandize to be landed or fhipped at, off, or from any Wharf or Wharfs within the faid City or the Liberties thereof at the Rates aforefaid, fuch Offender fhould forfeit for every fuch Offence the Sum of Ten Pounds to the Party or Parties thereby grieved, to be recovered with full Cofts of Suit, by Action of Debt, Bill, Plaint, or Information, in any of His Majefly's Courts of Record at Weftminfter or within the faid City of London, as the Caufe fhould arife, wherein no Effoin, Protection, or Wager of Law fhould be allowed, nor any more than one Imparlance.

And whereas, no Table of Rates has been yet affeiled or allowed for many Wharfs within the intent and meaning of the faid Act, but certain Rates have for a confiderable Time been taken for Wharfage and Cranage at all the faid Wharfs respectively, which have been submitted to as just and reafonable although not affeffed and allowed accord-

T the Court at St. James's, the 23d of July | ing to the faid Act : And whereas it has been reprefented to His Majefty by the humble Memorial of a great Number of respectable Merchants and Traders of the City of London and its Vicinity, that the Wharfingers have lately circulated a new Table of Rates increased in an extraordinary Degree, and in fome Inftances more than double the former Charges, which, if fubmitted to would be highly injurious to the general Trade in the Port of London: And whereas the Lords of His Ma-jefty's Moft Honorable Privy Council having taken the Matter of fuch Memorial into their Confider-ation, and having been attended thereupon by Counfel on the Part of the Wharfingers, and by Charles Price, Elquire, Alderman of the City of London, and others, on the Part of the Merchants; and their Lordships having heard all the faid Parties had to offer touching the same, came to a De-termination to advise His Majesty to establish, under the Authority of the before mentioned Act of Parliament fuch Rates of Wharfage and Cranage as were actually paid on the First Day of January One thousand leven hundred and ninety-four; and their Lordships were pleased to direct that the faid Merchants and Wharfingers should lay before their Lordships a correct State or Table of such Rates of Wharfage and Cranage as were to paid on the faid First Day of January One thousand feven hun-dred and ninety-four; and a State or Table of fuch Rates having been accordingly laid before their Lordfhips and admitted by the faid Merchants and Wharfingers refpectively, to be a true Table of the Rates of Wharfage and Cranage paid on the faid First Day of January One thousand feven hundred and ninety-four, which Rates are as follows : videlicet,
