Sunderland, April 26.

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He Veffel that was chaced in hither by the Dutch Squadron that appeared on these Coasts was a Prize taken the 15th Instant, by the Sweepstakes, called by the name of the Baker of Schelling , bound from Curland to Amsterdam, and laden with Hemp, Flix, Beef, Linen Yarn, and Linfeed: The Dutchmen of War are fince gone for the Coafts of Scotland, but we hear

not yet of any hurt they have done.

Berwick, April 28. The last Tuesday, being both Saint Georges Diy, and the Anniverlary of His Majesty's Coronation, the Mayor of this Town with his Brethren went according to their Custom to the Church in their Formalities, where their Devotion ended, they further proclaimed the So-lemnity of that Day by their Bells and Bonefires; but their walk to Church had like to have proved fatal to them, had not a great Providence prevented the contrivance of some Villain at had privately ram'd into one of the two Brais Guns Randing before the Main Guard (that were the Night before tharged with Powder) about eleven Musker Bullets, and many small stones, leaving in also the Stick they had made use of for that purpose; but the Gunner having with more than usual care searched the Piece before he discharged it, prevented the destructive intention of the Villain, which otherwife could not have failed of doing great Execution on them, they being to walk from the Mayors House to the Church, at leaft 200 yards together directly opposite to the mouth of the Guns, which were then to he e been fired.

Berne, April 18. The City of Geneva having made fe-veral Proposals to the Duke of Savey, for an amicable compolure of the differences rifen between them ; to which, they have not found the return which they expected, have given over the thoughts of any farther Addresses of this nature; baving erected a Gibber, to fignifie, that it shall be death to my person to make any farther motion for an Accommodation; and accordingly their preparations for War are on both fides vigorously carried on. The City daily receiving supplies from their Allies, both of Men, and all forts of necessaries for the War. Several G ntlemen are also arrived there from Languedos and Dauphine with above 600 Hugonots, who freely offer to hazard their lives in the defence of the Gity. The Count de Dona, and the Lieutenat General Baltagar, have so well mended the Fortifications of the Town, that they fear not any force that can be used against them, and such care has been taken for all forts of Necessiries, that they are sufficiently furnished to hold out a fiege of three years : having within the Town, besides the Townsmen that are well trained and disciplined, above 2000 flour Soldiers well resolved for their defence

The Savyards in their march into Lucern found some opposition from the forces there, but being much superior to them
in number, they obliged them to lock their safety in the
Mountains; since which, the Duke is resolved to send 3000
Forces of the Savet and to ruine Foot and 1000 Horse to march near to Geneva, and to ruine the Neighboring Towns: But this design was prevented by those of Geneva, who appeared so ready in their desence, that the Savoyards were forced to retire without effecting any thing confiderable.

The Dake has fent for Don Gabriel de Savoy from his

Government of Provence, to whom be intends to commit the command of his Cavalry in his Wars with Geneva.

Forrage begins to grow very scarce in their Horse quarters, insomuch as they have been forced to turn their Horses into

The States of Hungary are again affembled at Epperie. but upon what account, is not yet told us. The Prince Abaffi ftill continues his intentions of refigning up his Government in favor to the Count Tichely, who has already far infinuated into the affection of the Grandees, and may be in probability his Succeffor.

A party of the Hussars, to the number of 400, getting to-gether out of the Garrisons of Fillech, Caschau, and Sr. Andreas, fell lately upon some Turkish Merchants in their return from the Fair of Raab, whom they plundered, and were making their retreat with their prey; but a party of the Turks having intelligence of what had passed, put a stop to their march, who for a long time defended themselves with much courage; but the Turks at the last prevailing, out them in pieces, not above Four and twenty of the whole party elesping them, who fell afterwards into the hands of the Countrey people, who killed eighteen more of them, onely fix of the 400, with much difficulty faving themselves to report the news.

The Emperors Resident in the Polish Court, informs us, that the Turks had built two Forts upon the Territory of ukrania, with another in the way towards Patalsky, a For-tres, which is held to be the Key to the Kingdom of Poland, upon which place, they have a design, which they hope to profecute with better fuccels, then they had at the fiege of it in

former years.

A Chiaus is fud lenly expected here from the Vilier d'Offen, but his bufinels not known.

The Ambassacor from Poland is upon his way for Ratisbonne to make his Addresses to the States of the Empire, and to implore their affittance, his fuccefs is much doubted.

The Count de Pottingen, Ambassador at Madrid, hath dispatched hitter the Matter of his Houshold, to give an account to this Court, of the Queens Mothers health, and of the ftare of affairs there, and has withal defired the favor to be recalled from that employmen.

Ertford, April 24.
