

Whitehall, December 2, 1800.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that several outrageous and atrocious Acts have of late been committed in the Town and County of Haverfordwest, and its Neighbourhood, by burning Two Stacks of Hay, the Properties of John Higgon, Esq; and Doctor Edwardes, and maiming a Mare belonging to Doctor Nash; as also several inflammatory threatening Letters have been sent to various Inhabitants of the said Town;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Felonies above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them (except the Persons who actually committed the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

PORTLAND.

And, as a further Encouragement a Reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS is hereby offered by the Inhabitants of the said Town, to any one who shall make Discovery of the Persons who set Fire to the said Hay-Stacks; and ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS to any one who shall make Discovery of the Persons concerned in maiming the said Mare, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders, by the Mayor of the said Town.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that as the Dover Stage-Coach, the Property of John Roberts, of Fetter-Lane, London, was travelling from London, on Tuesday Evening the 18th Ultimo, it was attacked on the Highway between Shooters-Hill and Welling by Three or more Footpads, who robbed the Coach and Passengers; and One of the Footpads, in the most wanton and inhuman Manner, fired at and wounded William Truss, then riding as Guard of the said Coach, of which Wounds he died;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the above Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually fired at and wounded the said Guard,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that on the Morning of the 25th Ultimo, a seditious and treasonable Paper, tending to excite the People to Acts of Violence, was discovered upon an outside Gate leading to a Malt Office in the Town of Ipswich;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in writing the said Paper is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person who actually wrote the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of FIFTY POUNDS is hereby offered to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before

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excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders by the Bailiffs of the said Town of Ipswich.
