'The KING's Most Excellent Majefty in Council. HEREAS His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Twenty-fixth Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers em-ployed on Shore for railing Men for the Service. of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforefaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each-Man, as His Majefty's Royal Bounty : And whereas His Majefty was alfo gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of the faid Month of February, One thousand feven hundred and ninety-three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Scaman fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him or themielves, fo that fuch Seaman or Scamen should be taken for His Majesty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefly's Sea Officers appointed to raiie Men on Shore, or by the Captains or Commanders of any of His Majefty's Ships or Veffels in the Ports, or on the Coafts of this Kingdom: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant January; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it

is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Tint limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-firlt Day of this influite January to the Thirty-firlt Day of April One thousand eight hun-dred and one, incinfive: When of all Perfore conceracd are to take Nutice, and govern themfelves W. Fawkener. accordingly.
