Art. XIII. The Ports of the Colony shall be ! opened to all American Vessels, who shall be per-mitted to import Provisions and Supplies, and to · export Produce; the Inhabitants shall enjoy the same Liberty of Importation and Exportation in their own Veffels.

Answer .- The same Indulgencies will be granted to all American Vessels, as in the Islands under His Britannic Majesly's Government. The Inhabitants taking the Oath of Allegiance, will enjoy the same Privileges with respect to Trade, as in the British ♦Colonics.
