to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that all His loving Subjects may lawfully trade to and from the faid Islands of Saint Martin and Saint Eustatius, subject nevertheless to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, to which the Trade to and from His Majesty's Colonies, Plantations, and Islands in the West Indies, is, or shall be subject by Law: And His Majetty is further pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, That all Commodities being of the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of the faid Islands of Saint Martin and Saint Eustatius being in His Majesty's Possession, shall be permitted to be imported into any of the Ports of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in British Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigable according to Law, subject to the same Duties, Rules, Regulations, Restrictions, Conditions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, as Articles of the like Sort are subject to, coming from His Majesty's Colonics, Plantations, or Islands in the West Indies: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's VV Order in Council of the Third Day of December last, prohibiting the Transportation into any Parts out of this Kingdom, of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, will expire upon the Tenth Day of this instant June: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do, at any Time for the Space of Six Months, to commence from the iaid Tenth Day of this instant June, export, or attempt to export, transport, carry, or convey, or lade, or lay on board of any Ship, Vessel, or Boat, in order to be exported, transported, carried, or conveyed out of this Kingdom, any of the Wood called Lignum Vitæ, without Leave or Permission being first had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for indemnifying all Persons who have "been concerned in advising or carrying into Exe-cution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of " His Majefly's Treafury respecting the Exportation " of Pot-Ashes or Pcarl-Ashes; for preventing Suits in consequence of the same; for authorizing His " Majesty to prohibit the Exportation or carrying "Coastwife of Pot Ashes or Pearl-Ashes, and for " making further Provisions relative thereto:" But it is, nevertheless, His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board any of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ, which may be necessary for the Use of the said Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage; nor to prevent the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitae to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernfey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majetty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that, upon the Exportation of the faid Wood called Lignum Vitæ to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements
