## By the KING.

A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Ceffation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, agreed upon between His Majefty and the French Republic, and enjoining the Observance thereof. GEORGE R.

HEREAS Preliminaries for reftoring Peace between Us and the French Republic were figned at London on the First Day of this instant October, by the Plenipotentiary of Us, and by the Plenipotentiary of the French Republic: And whereas, for the putting an End to the Calamities of War, as foon and as far as may be possible, it hath been agreed between Us, and the French Republic, as follows; that is to fay, That as foon as the Preli-minaries shall be figned and ratified, Friendship should be established between Us and the French Republic, by Sea and Land, in all Parts of the World, and that all Hostilities should cease immediately; and in order to prevent all Caufes of Com-plaint and Difpute which might arife on account of Prizes which might be made at Sea, after the Sig-nature of the Preliminary Articles, it has been allo reciprocally agreed, That the Veffels and Effects which might be taken in the British Channel and in the North Seas, after the Space of Twelve Days, to be computed from the Exchange of the Ratifications of the Preliminary Articles, fhould be reflored on each Side; That the Term should be One Month from the British Channel and the North Seas as far as the Canary Islands inclusively, whether in the Ocean or in the Mediterranean; Two Months from the faid Canary Islands, as far as the Equator; and laftly, Five Months in all other Parts of the World, without any Exception, or any more particular Defcription of Time or Place : And whereas the Ratifications of the faid Preliminary Articles between Us and the French Republic were exchanged by the respective Plenipotentiaries of Us, and of the French Republic, on the Tenth Day of this inflant October, from which Day the feveral Terms above-mentioned of Twelve Days, of One Month, of Two Months, and Five Months, are to be computed : And whereas it is Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That the Ceffation of Hostilities between Us and the French Republic should be agreeable to the feveral Epochs fixed

between Us and the French Republic, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to notify the fame to all Our loving Subjects; and We do declare, That Our Royal Will and Pleafure is, and We do hereby firicitly charge and command all Our Officers both at Sea and Land, and all other Our Subjects whatfoever, to forbear all Acts of Hoftility, either by Sea or Land, again the French Republic, and their Allies, their Vaffals or Subjects, from and after the respective Times above-mentioned, and under the Penalty of incurring Our higheft Difpleafure.

Given'at Our Court at Windfor, the Twelfth Day of this inftant October, in the Forty-first Year of Our Reign, and in the Year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and one.
