W HEREAS the Time limited by His Majely's Order in Council, of the Thirtieth of July One thousand eight hundred and one, prohibiting the exporting into any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, of any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or of Copper in fuch a State as may be eafily converted into, or made uleful as a Naval Store, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of this inftant February; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Majefty doth, therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, and command, That no Perfon or Perfons whofoever do, at any Time during the Space of Two Months, to com-mence from the faid Twelfth Day of this inflant February, prefume to export out of this Kingdom to any Parts beyond the Seas, within the Limits of Europe, any Sheet Copper, or Copper in Boltstaves, Bars, Sheets, Rings, and Nails, or any Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, or ship, or lade any of the Articles above-mentioned, on board any Ship or Veffel in order to exporting the fame beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion being first had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty third Year of His Majefty's Reign, Cap. 2. and alfo by an Act paffed in the Thirty-fourth Year of His Ma-

jefty's Reign, Cap. 34 : But it is neverthelefs Hie Majefty's Pleafure, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to the Exportation of any of the aforefaid Articles from Great Britain to Ireland, or from Ireland to Great Britain, respectively, or to any Exportation of any of the faid Articles, by, or on board of His Majefty's Ships of War, or any other Ships, or Veffels, or Boats in the Service of His Majefty, or employed or freighted by His Majefty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of the faid Articles as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Voyage, or to any Exportation thereof by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or from the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being, or from the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons within the Limits of Europe, nor to the Exportation of any of the faid Articles to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, provided that in cafe of the Exportation to any Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, either of Copper being a Naval Store, or of Copper capable of being converted into a Naval Store, the Exporters thereof do first make Oath of the true Defination of the faid Artilces to the Port or Place without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame shall respectively be entered outwards, before the Entry of the fame shall be made, and do give full and fufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Great Britain, or to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Cafe may be, to carry the faid Articles to the Port or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which the fame fhall refpectively be entered out-wards, and fuch Bond fhall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in Great Britain, or to the Commiffioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, as the Cafe may be, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the faid Commiffioners refpectively, and specified in such Bond of a Certificate or Certificates in fuch Form and Manner as shall be directed by the faid Commissioners respectively, as the Cafe may be, thereby shewing that the faid Articles have been duly landed at the Port or Place, without the Limits of Europe, for which they were respectively entered outwards : And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the neceffary Directions herein as to them may refpectively appertain.
