

Sark, or Man, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of the said Wood called Lignum Vitæ do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which it shall be entered Outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Wood called Lignum Vitæ to the Places for which it is so entered Outwards, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled, or delivered up, until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Wood called Lignum Vitæ has been duly landed at the Places for which it was entered Outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint His Grace George William Frederick Duke of Leeds to be Lord Lieutenant of the North Riding of the County of York, His Grace this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

His Excellency the Count de Woronzow, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from His Imperial Majesty of all the Russias, having obtained His Imperial Majesty's Leave of Absence from the Court of London for Six Months, had this Day a private Audience of His Majesty, being introduced thereto by the Right Honorable Lord Hawkesbury, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Stephen Cottrell, Knight, Master of the Ceremonies.

The King has been pleased to grant unto John Smith, of Combhay, in the County of Somerset, Esq; Son and Heir of John Smith, late of the same Place, Esq; deceased, by Anne his Wife, Daughter of Thomas Charles Lord Viscount Tracy, and Sister of Thomas Charles, John, and Henry, successively Viscounts Tracy, of the Kingdom of Ireland, and Grand-Daughter of Jane Viscountess Tracy, Wife of William Viscount Tracy, which Jane Viscountess Tracy, was a Daughter of Sir Thomas Leigh, Knight, eldest Son of Thomas the First, Lord

Leigh, of Stoneleigh, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue may assume, take, and use the Surname of Leigh, instead of that of Smith, and bear the Arms of Leigh, such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Herald's Office:
