GEORGE R.

HEREAS by Our Proclamation of the Twenty-fixth Day of April last, We did appoint and command, that a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God should be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom called Scotland, upon Toesday the First Day of June next: And whereas it hath been represented to U:, That the faid Day will be inconvenient for the Celebration thereof, on account of the Sitting of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland: We, therefore, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, illst the faid General Thanklgiving to Almighty God; be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom called Scotland, upon Thursday the Seventeenth Day of June next, inteed of Tuesday the First Day of June next: And We do strictly charge and command, That the faid Publick Thanksgiving be reverently and decently observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the fald Seventeenth Day of June next. as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may justly inflict on all fuch as contemn of neglect the Performance of fo religious a Duty: Our Will and Pleasure is therefore, and We charge, That this Our Proclamation feen, ye pals to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance; and Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do casse printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sheriffs of the several Shires, Stewarts of Srewartries, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published: And We appoint them to fend Copies thereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the same may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.
