

Newton, were wilfully and maliciously set on Fire, and wholly destroyed.

July 19, A large Hay Rick, at Bradford, the Property of Mr. Tanner, Manufacturer, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire, and destroyed.

July 22, The Mills at Littleton, in the Parish of Steeple Ashton, Wilts, belonging to Mr. Naish, of Trowbridge, were attacked by an Armed Body of Men, (many of whom had their Faces blacken'd,) and who wilfully and maliciously set Fire to, and wholly destroyed the same, with the Machinery, and Stock in Trade therein, to a very considerable Amount, after which they went away threatening Destruction to other Mills.

July 24, This Night Two Ricks of Hay, the Property of Mr. Newman, Manufacturer, of Melksham, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire.

July 28, The Factory at Staverton, belonging to Messrs. Jones and Co. was again attacked by an Armed Body of Men, who fired from Three different Parts at the Centinel on Duty.

July 29, In the Night, a Dwelling-House, situate at Bearfield, near Bradford, the Property of John Jones, Esq; was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire and destroyed.

August 3, An extensive Building, situate in Trowbridge, belonging to Messrs. Naish and Goldfinch, (in which was a considerable Quantity of Machinery, Wool, &c. belonging to Mr. Naish,) was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire and wholly destroyed.

August 31, Two Cottages, a Stable, and Out-Houses, situate at the Common, in the Parish of Warminster, in the County of Wilts, belonging to Mr. George Warren, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire, and wholly destroyed.

September 9, Between Nine and Ten o'Clock in the Evening, a Gun was fired into the Window of a Sitting-Room in the House of Mr. John Bleck, of Warminster.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Felonies above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them, (except the Person or Persons who actually set any of the several Premises and Matters aforesaid, on Fire, or who actually wrote the said Letters,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices in any or either of the above Felonies, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

THE Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half Pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st January to the 30th June 1802, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf, these are to give Notice, that the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of the Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning on the following Days, viz.

On Monday the 4th October next, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

On Tuesday the 5th, and Wednesday the 6th October, to Lieutenants and their Attornies; and

On Thursday the 7th October, to Masters and Surgeons, and their Attornies.

After which the List will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore during the Time they are to be paid Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have submitted to the Test, and taken the Oath of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

When Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave before the Half-Pay can be paid.

And as by an Act of Parliament passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Mode for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, "That if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act."
