THE King has been graciously pleased, in con-inderation of the fignal and very diffinguished Services performed to His Majelty, and to His Ally the Ottoman Emperor, by Sir William Sidney Smith, Knight, Commander and Grand Cross of the Royal Swedish Military Order of the Sword, a Captain in the Royal Name and Representative for the Royal Swedin Military Order of the Sword, a Captain in the Royal Navy, and Reprefentative for the City of Rochefter in the Parliament of the United Kingdom; and to evince the Senfe which His Majefty entertains of the great Ability and heroic Perfeverance manifefted by him the faid Sir William Sidney Smith upon divers Occafions, and more efpecially of his able and highly diffinguided more especially of his able and highly diftinguished Conduct in the Defence of the Town of St. John d'Acre, in Syria, in the Year 1799; to grant His Royal Licence and Authority, that he may bear the following honorable Augmentations to the Armorial Enligns borne by his Family, viz. on the Cheveron a Wreath of Laurel, accompanied by Two Croffes Cal-vary; and, on a Chief of Augmentation, the Interior of an arcient Fortification, in perspetive; in the Angle a Breach; and, on the Sides of the faid Breach, the Standard of the Ottoman Empire, and the Union Flag of Great Britain, as then difplayed : And, for Creft, The Imperial Ottoman Chelengk, or Plume of Triumph, upon a Turban; in allulion to the highly honorable and diffinguished Decoration transmitted by His faid Imperial Majefty to Sir William Sidney Smith, in teltimony of his Esteem, and in acknowlegement of his meritorious Exertions in the aforefaid Defence : And the Family Creft, viz. A Leopard's Head, collared and lined, *iffuant out of an Oriental Crown:* The faid Arms and Crefts to be borne by him the faid Sir William Sidney Smith, and by his Iffue, together with the Motto "CœUR DE LION." And, although the Privilege of bearing Supporters be limited to the Peers of the Realm, the Knights of His Majerty's Orders, and the Prozies of Princes of the Blood Royal at Installations, except in fuch of the Block Royal at Initializons, except in lucin Cafes wherein, under particular Circumtances, His Majefty has been pleafed to grant His effecial Li-cence for the Ufe thereof; yet, in order to give a further Teftimony of His Majefty's particular Ap-probation of the Services of the faid Sir William Sidney Smith, He has been graciously pleafed to willow him to hear for Supporters to his Arms. allow him to bear, for Supporters to his Arms,

A Tiger guardant, navally crowned; in the Mouth a Palm Branch, being the Symbol of Victory, Supporting Paim Branch, being the Symbol of Victory, Jupporting the Union Flag of Great Britain, with the Infeription "JERUSALEM. 1799" upon the Crofs of St. George; and A Lamb, murally crowned; in the Month an Olive Branch, being the Symbol of Peace, fupporting the Banner of Jerufalem: The faid Armorial Enligns being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office: And also order that this His Maiofre's frid

And alfo to order that this His Majefty's faid Concession and especial Mark of His Royal Favor be registered in His College of Arms.
