

GENERAL ORDERS.

His Majesty's Guards, March 12, 1803.

IT is the King's Pleasure, that, notwithstanding any Leave of Absence granted by His Majesty, or by the Commander in Chief, all Officers belonging to Regiments in Great Britain, or on Foreign Stations, do join their respective Corps without Delay, except such Officers as are employed on the Recruiting Service.

WHEREAS the Select Committee appointed to try and determine the Merits of the Petition of Thomas Sheridan and William Ogilvie, Esquires, and also the Petition of Samuel Mitchell, Josiah Abraham, and the several other Persons whose Names are thereunto subscribed, severally complaining of an undue Election and Return for the Borough of Liskeard, in the County of Cornwall, have this Day reported to the House of Commons, 'That it appeared to the said Select Committee that the Merits of the Petitions did depend upon the Right of Election; and that therefore the said Committee required the Counsel for the several Parties to deliver to the Clerk of the said Committee Statements, in Writing, of the Right of Election for which they respectively contended:

'That, in consequence thereof, the Counsel for the Petitioners Thomas Sheridan and William Ogilvie, Esquires, and also for the several other Petitioners before-mentioned, delivered in a Statement as follows:

"Borough of Liskeard.—The Petitioners contend the Right of Election for Burgesses to serve in Parliament to be in the Inhabitants paying, or liable to pay, Scot and Lot."

'That the Counsel for the Sitting Members, the Honorable John Eliot and the Honorable William Eliot, delivered in a Statement as follows:

"Borough of Liskeard.—Statement of Right of Election, as insisted on by the Sitting Members: That the Right of Election of Burgesses to serve in Parliament for the said Borough is in the Mayor and Burgesses of the said Borough."

'That upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the said several Petitioners, the said Select Committee have determined,

"That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is not the Right of Election for the Borough of Liskeard, in the County of Cornwall."

'That, upon the Statement delivered in by the Counsel for the Sitting Members, the said Select Committee have determined,

"That the Right of Election, as set forth in the said Statement, is the Right of Election for the said Borough of Liskeard."

I do hereby give you this Notice, in pursuance of the Directions of the Act made in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the further Regulation of

"the Trials of Controverted Elections, or Return of Members to serve in Parliament."
