## TO OFFICERS ON HALF-PAY.

War-Office, March 12, 1803. LL Officers on the Half-Pay of the Land A Forces, refident in Great Britain and Ircland, who are not ferving in the Militia, or who do not hold Offices under Government, are hereby required immediately to transmit to the Inspecting Field-Officers of the Recruiting Dillricts within which they respectively refide, an Account in Writing, of their Age, palt Services, and present Place of Abode, in order that their Services may be called for as Circumflances shall render it expedient: And theh as think themfelves, from Age or Infirmities, unit for farther Service, even in this Country, are to accompany their Reports with fufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Caufes thereof.

Such Officers on Half-Pay as are ferving in the Militia, or are otherwife employed under Government, (Officers of the Yeomanry and Volunteer Corps excepted, whole Reports are to be made to the Infpecting Field Officers of Didricts as abovementioned,) are to transmit fimilar Accounts to the Secretary at War, specifying also the Nature of the

public Situations which they poffeis. The Infpecting Field-Officers of Districts will make Returns to the Secretary at War of the Names of the Officers who shall report themselves in purfuance of the above Notice. And every Officer who shall neglect to make his Report, either to a Diffriet Field-Officer, or to the Secretary at War, according to the Circumstances of his Situa-tion, within one Month from the Date hereof, will be confidered as otherwife provided for, or dead, and his Name will be flruck off the Half Pay Lift accordingly.
