overthrow and defiroy our excellent and revered Government and Conflictution by a deliberate and atrocious Defigu against the facred Person of your Majefty.

Deeply impressed with the great Happinels we renjoy under the paternal Government of your Majeity, in the impartial Protection of our Perfons and Properties, and the Exercise of true Liberty, we cannot sufficiently express our Indignation and Abhorrence of the traitorous Machinations of the late infatuated and wicked Confpirators; and we feel a renewed, and, if possible, an additional Impulse for the Prefervation of your Majesty's ineftimable Life.

We confider the late Attempt as one of the laft Heads of that Hydra of Faction and Anarchy which has menaced civil Society in these portentous Times; and trust that, under Divine Providence, and by the united Vigilance and Exertions of your Majelty's Ministers and loyal Subjects, your Majelty may long live to reign in the Hearts of a free People, and preferve the Independence, Honor, Prosperity, and Peace of the United Kingdom against all treasonable or ambitious Projects both of domefic and foreign Enemies.

WHEREAS His Majefty was gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March last, to promife and declare, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majefty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby-directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who flould, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then following, enter themselves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majefty's Ships, or Officers employed in Tenders, or at Rendezvous on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy : And whereas His Majefty was also graciously pleased, by His faid Proclamation, to declare, that all Able-bodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man as His Majefty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majefty was also gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing equal Date, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships, should be paid to any Perfon who should difcover [

any Seaman or Seamen, who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's Service, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next, by any of His Majefty's Sea-Officers employed for raifing Men: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations respectively, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward, will expire upon the Thirtieth Day of this inftant April; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer, His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order. and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this inftant April to the Thirtieth Day of June next inclusive; whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves accordingly. WHEREAS, in purfuance of the Powers vefted in His Majefty, by an Act paffed in the present Seffion of Parliament, intituled " An Act " to continue, until the First Day of January " One thousand eight hundred and four, feveral " Laws relating to the prohibiting the Exporta-" tion and permitting the Importation of Corn, " and for allowing the Importation of other Ar-" ticles of Provision without Payment of Duty; " to the Relief of Captors of Prizes, with respect " to the bringing and landing certain Prize Goods " in this Kingdom; and to the regulating the " Trade and Commerce to and from the Ifle of " Malta ;" His Majefty was pleafed, by His Order in Council, bearing Date the Thirty-first of December laft, to order, and it was thereby ordered, That the Prohibition laid, by Order of His Majefty in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, upon the Exportation from any Port or Place in Great Britain of any Wheat, Rye, Barley, Beer or Bigg, Peafe, Beans, Oats, or any Meal or Flour, or Bread, Bifcuit, or Malt made thereof, or of any Indian Corn or Maize, or Meal or Flour made thereof; and alfo the Liberty, granted by the faid-Order in Council, bearing Date the Twelfth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and one, to import and take out of Warehouse Foreign Corn and other Articles as aforefaid, and likewife to import fundry other Articles of Provision Duty free, should be further continued until the Thirty-first Day of March list, fave and except the Importation, Duty free, of the Articles of Rice
