## Zant, Sept. 15.

He first Instant appeared in fight of this place, five Prench men of War and two Fireships, under the Comreand of the Sieur du Quefne, they came not in, but tent in their Boatsfor fome Provisions, and having received them, flood off again in fearch of the Tripolins that are in these parts; and we have this day an Account, that they have taken two Vessels, longing to Tripoly, laden with Salt, and Negro Slaves.

Cadiz, Offeb, s, Two ships which have been long expected, arrived h re fome days fince from the Indies; by them we have an account, that feveral Free-booters having landed at the Port of Ballimentos, marched from thence in five days over the Mountains to Torro Bello, and attack d the place, which the Garrifon abandoned, and retired into the Citta el; That the Freebooters having plundered the Town, and taken 35000 Crowns in Money, puffed the Gulph of Darien, and having the Indians, who are no friends to the paniards, for Guides, marched in nine days to the South Sea, within a mile of Panama, where they found leveral Canues, and paffed in them to Pericq, where they made themselves Masters of three Ships and one Bark, from there th y went to Panama, and plundered the Suburbs; after which they continued feveraldays Mafters at Sca, but its believed they retired upon the Advice that came from Cartagena, that they were fending against them 400 Soldiers from thence, and two men of War from Lima. Madrid, Odlob. 10. The laft week the King and

Queen. as they came from Noftre Dame d' Atocha, were furprized with a great fail of Waler from the Mountains, occasioned by the violent Rains, which was fo fuddain, that though two Coaches that went before, paff d without any difficulty, yet that their Majellies were in, was in great danger, the Water in fome places they were to pais, being for deep that the foremost Horses were put to swim, but the Coachman immediately ftopping the other Horles, gave their Majeflies time to get out of the Coach. Besides the 500000 Crowns we have already told you were remitted to Flanders, we understand that the Bankers have been agred with to pay 200000 more to the Prince of Parma. The Council of the Indies, upon the Advice they have of the Enterprize of the Free-booters upon Porto-Bello and P4nama, have refolved to find thither 300 old Soldiers, and have given Power to Don Melchior de Nawarra, who is going Viceroy of Peru to condemn, and cause to be executed, without any Appeal, all fuch perfons as shall be found not to have done their, Duty on this occasion; and if it shall appear that the whole Garrisons of Porto Bello and Panama have been wanting therein, to caufe them to be Decima-The faid Viceroy will part from Cadiz with ted. the Galcons, the toth of November.

Madrid, Octob. 17. Letters from Cadiz of the 6th Is flant Advise, that the App Yacht was just then ar fved there from Tangier, and reported, that they left the English engaged nith the Moors on the third That bokilizes began on the 25th of Septemb r 5 that twe English had regained the Ground upon which Pole Fort flood; and in the Altion had lost 20 Men, had 5c wounded, and ten Horfes killed, that the Enemy did not appear to be in number above 2000, but that it was juspetted they lay in Ambuscade.

From SCIIC of the 8th Inflant they write, that they had Advice from Vangi v, that upon the expiring of the Truce, and the beginning of Holfilities by the Moors, the Engligh murched out of the Town, that they had maintained the Field three or four days, had retaken, and were fortifing Pole Fort; that the Scotch Grenadiers had adon's or fileratile execution upon the Moors in their Trenches, and that the So diers in general had behaved themseives very bravely.

Berlin, Odob, 22. The Prince of Orange receives at this Court all the Respects that can be shown him; on Monday last there was a Hu ting of the wild Bore, the next day the Electres entertained his Highness at Caput, and this day he came hither to visit the Electoral Princess; at his coming into the Town, being with the Elector in his Calché, the Canon round the Walls were discharged, as they were likewise at his going out again. To morrow there is another Hunting of the Bore and the Stag, and on Thuisday the Prince returns for Halland.

Francfort, Octob. 23. Yefferday arrived here the Elector Palatine in his way home, he wsteccived by the Burghers in Arms, falued with a Difcharge of all our Canon, a decomplimented by our Magilirates, and preferred with Wine and other Provisions. This day his Elector 1 Highiefs pa. ted again for Manbeim.
