

the dispute, had so much the better of it, that they seized on twelve of the chief of those that opposed them, and sent them Prisoners to *Franchimont*: That the City of *Lige* being much alarmed thereat, had sent four Companies of Foot and some Horse to *Perriers*, to force the Elector's Troops from thence. These things put us here into great confusion.

Brussels Octob. 25. The Governors of the several Provinces, and the Deputies of the States of those Provinces are come hither to make their Compliments to our new Governor the Prince of *Parma*, who has not yet appeared in publicke, he has held a Council of War, in order to the informing himself of the true state of the Militia of these Countries, which is said, his Highness resolves to increase to 40000 Foot, 4000 Horse, and 1000 Dragoons. The Marquis de *Bourgomano*, Ambassador from the King of *Spain* to the Emperor, is still detained here by his indisposition. From *Liege* we have an Account, of great disturbances, on occasion of the new Imposition laid upon all Merchandizes, by the Elector of *Cologne* their Prince.

Brussels, Octob. 29. On Sunday last the Prince of *Parma* appeared in publick for the first time, as Governor-Gen-ral of these Provinces; about four in the afternoon he went to the Cathedral, where *Te Deum* was sung, accompanied with the Governors of the Provinces, General Officers, and the rest of the Nobility in their Coaches; his Highness had seven of his own, whereof two were very rich, and six Trumpets, 30 Footmen, and 16 Pages in rich Liveries. After *Te Deum*, the Canon was discharged round the Town, and his Highness went to the Courts, and so returned to the Palace. The Sieur *Pelleier*, the first of the French Commissioners for the Conferences at *Courtray* continuing still at *Paris*, the chief of the Spanish Commissioners remains likewise here, so that there seems little appearance as yet of renewing those Conferences, for the adjusting the Limits.

Paris Octob. 26. The Princess of *Conti* has been very ill of a Fever, but is at present much better. It is said that there has been some disorder at *Maficon* on account of a new Imposition upon Wine; and that 1200 Soldiers are marching thither, who are to be quartered upon the Inhabitants of the place. The 23 Instant dyed *Elizabeth de la Tour d'Auvergne*, Dutchesse d'*Elbeuf*, in the 45 year of her age; she was Daughter to *Frederick Maurice, de la Tour*, Duke of *Bouillon*, and married in the year 1656. to *Charles of Lorraine*, Duke d'*Elbeuf*, at present the first Prince of the House of *Lorraine* in *France*; she has left five Children, the Prince d'*Elbeuf*, the Abbot of *Lorraine*, and the Prince *Emanuel*, and two Daughters, who are both Religious. From *Lisbon* they write, that great quarrels had happened there between several French and Portuguese Gentlemen, on occasion of the Dispute between the Chevalier de *Lery*, and the Portuguese Frigats, concerning the Salute, which the Portuguese did extremely resent.

Paris, Octob. 30. On Saturday last the Cardinal d'*Estree* parted from hence for *Rome*, whither he is sent by the King, to endeavour to accommodate the differences between that Court and this, concerning the Regality. The Dauphine is it said has an Ague. The Prince of *Conde* is pretty well again. From *Lorraine* they write, that several Troops came that way, which, and the Orders that have been given to buy 2000 Horses for the service of the Ar-

tillery, makes people believe, there is a design towards *Alsace*, which may yet discover it self this Winter. We are told, that the King is going to send the Sieur *Govenille* to several Princes of the Empire.

Whitehal, Octob. 22. On Tuesday last arrived the Count de *Turen*, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor; and this Evening he had Audience of His Majesty, being Conducted by Sir *Charles Cotterel* Master of the Ceremonies.

Whitehal Octob. 22. Yesterday the Parliament met at Westminster, and His Majesty being come into the House of Lords in his Royal Robes, with the usual Solemnity and the House of Commons attending, His Majesty was pleased to make a most Gracious Speech to the two Houses; after which the Lord Chancellor, by His Majesties Command, directed the Commons to return to their House, and to proceed to the choice of a Speaker, which they accordingly did, and unanimously Elected *William Williams*, Esq; of *Grays Inn*, Counsellor at Law, and Recorder of *Chester*, who was this afternoon Presented to His Majesty Seated in his Throne in the House of Lords, and approved by him.
