Feeling as we do in common with your Majefty's other Subjects the diffinguifhed and peculiar Privileges we enjoy as a Nation and as Individuals, it was with the utmost Indignation that we viewed the late atrocious Confpiracy, which aimed at nothing lefs than to deprive us of thefe Bleffings, which aimed a Blow at the Life of a Soverrign fo juftly dear to us all, and, in fine, which threatened to reduce us from the higheft State of political Happinels to the oppofite Extreme of Anarchy, Con-Jusion, and Distrefs.

With thefe Seatuments imprefied upon our Hearts, we feel it our bounden Duty to offer to your Ma-jelly this our unfeigned Tribute of loyal Congratulation; and we feel grateful to those Minifers by whofe Vigilance and Activity fo during an Enterprife was crushed before it reached Maturity
