We are fully fensible, that your Majefty has shewn, during a patient and long protracted Nego-ciation, the utmost Defire to preferve the Bleffings of Peace.

We are confident that the unprovoked Aggreffion of the Government of France, and a Spirit manifefted by it, inconfiftent with the general Safety of the Liberties of Europe, has made necessary the energetic Determination of your Majefty's Councils; and we are ready to support, with our Lives and Fortunes, whatever Measures your Majefty shall deem expedient to adopt for the Support of the Dignity of the Crown and the Safety of your People.
