The Affidavit, drawn according to the above Form, dated and attefted by a Magistrate, is to be

put up in a Cover, and fent by the General Poft, directed thus, " To the Right Honorable the Pay " malter-General, at the Horfe Guards, London " And Counterparts, or Duplicates, of the faid Affidavits, are to be referved by the Out Penfioners respectively, to be exhibited to fuch Perfons as shall be directed to pay them, that they may be fatisfied that all fuch as may claim Out Penfions are the real Perfons entitled to receive the fame.

And to the End that the Commiffiners for the Affairs of Chelfea Holpital may be fatisfied that the Penfioners are the fame Perfons who have passed their Examination, it is hereby further directed, that fuch of them who have ferved in, and have been difcharged from, any of the Regiments, or Inde-pendent Companies of Invalids, are not to mention in their Affidavits Inch Regiment or Company of Invalids in which they ferved last, but the Regiment, Troop, or Corps of the Army, from which they were first difcharged, and recommended, and received at Chelfea Hofpital.

And as the General Payments in Great Britain and Ireland, at the End of the enfuing Six Months, are generally regulated by the Places of Refidence mentioned by the Penfioners, who are multered at Chelfea in Perfon, and in the Body of the Affidavits of those who live at a Distance, it is hereby ordered and directed, that no Perfon who shall change the Place of his Abode given in at his Muster, or fpecified in his Affidavit aforefaid, and who may apply for his Penfion (excepting to the Officers of Excise nearest such Place of Abode), shall receive the same, unless it appears by the Certificate of respectable Perfons, that such Removal was through unavoidable Neceffity, which he or they could not forefee or prevent.

It is also hereby notified, that none will be entered upon the Pay Lifts of the faid Hofpital, or be entitled to receive any Benefit therefrom, who shall not act agreeably to these Orders and Directions.

And His Majefty has been pleafed to command, on this Occasion, that all the Lettermen, Serjeants, Trumpeters, and Drummers, on the Out Pension of Chelfea, or Kilmainham Holpitals, reliding within the above Diltrict, whether difeharged from the Regular Cavalry or Infantry, or from the Militia, or Fencibles, (tuch Men as by the Hofpital Books, are now more than Sixty Years of Age, or who have lolt a Limb, or their Eye-light, or are Cripples, or who received a Certificate of their total Unfitnefs. for further Service, from any of the Officers employed at the General Examination of Out Penfioners, in the Month of December 1802, excepted,) do, at the Times of their Appearance, as above mentioned, put themfelves under the Orders of the Officers, who have been appointed to take them in Charge, and to caufe them to be examined, as to their Fitnels for Duty, either in the Army of Referve, or on fuch other Service, as His Majetty may think proper to employ them upon, for the Defence of the Realm.

His Majefty is gracioufly pleafed to declare, that all the faid Lettermen, Serjeants, Trumpeters, and Drummers shall be confidered as entitled to the Pention for the Six Months commencing from Midfummer laft, notwithstanding those found fit for Service will commence Pay according to the Ranks which they held when difcharged, from the refpective
