An Act for the better Prefervation of Heath Fowl, commonly called Black Game, in the New Foreft, in the County of Southampton.

An Act to explain and amend Two Acts, made in the Second, and Thirty-ninth, and Fortieth Years of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, for preventing the committing of Thefts and Frauds by Perfons navigating Bum Boats and other Boats upon the River Thames, and for the more effectual Prevention of Depredations thereon, fo far as relates to the Seizure of Excileable Commodities.

An Act for enlarging and altering the Term and Powers of feveral Acts of Parliament for making a Road from New-Street, Southwark, to the Places therein mentioned, and from Free-School Street, Southwark, to Dock-Head and Lilliput-Hall Bridge, in Bermondfey; and from the Stones-End in Kent-Street, Southwark, to Dartford, fo far as respects the Road leading from the Stones-End in Bermondley Street, towards Saint Thomas-a-Waterings; and also for repairing and maintaining a certain Lane called Long Lane, in the Parish of Bermondsey, in the County of Surrey

An Act for repairing, altering, and widening the Road from a Lane called Back-Lane, in the Parish

An Act for the Suppression of Rebellion in Ireland, and for the Protection of the Perfons and Property of His Majefty's faithful Subjects there, to continue in Force until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament.

An A& to empower the Lord Lieutenant, or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, to apprehend and detain fuch Perfons as he or they shall suspect for confpiring against His Majesty's Per-fon and Government, until Six Weeks after the commancement of the next Seffion of Parliament.

An Act to render more effectual an Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, relating to the Discovery of the Longitude at Sea, and for continuing the Encouragement of Persons making certain Difcoveries for finding the Longitude at Sea, or other ufeful Dilcoveries and Im-provements in Navigation, and for making Experiments relating thereto, and for difcharging certain Debts incurred by the Commilfioners of the Longitude, in carrying the Acts relating thereto into Execution.

An Act for improving the Funds of the Cheft at Chatham, and for transferring the Administration of the fame to Greenwich Holpital, and for ameliorating the Condition of the Penfioners on the faid Funds.
