A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

7 HEREAS divers Perfons have been guilty of the illegal Practices of clandeltinely importing and running of prohibited and uncultomed Goods, and thereby fubjected themfelves to great Penalties, for which fome have been already con-victed, fome are in Execution for the fame, and others are under Profecution, and many more liable to such Penalties, in confequence of which they abscond, or are gone into foreign Parts, which has, or may prove the Ruin of themselves and their Families: And whereas they may yet be of Ule to Us and their Country in the prefent Conjuncture of Affairs, in cafe they are rendered capable thereof by Our gracious Pardou; We being defirous of giving them an Opportunity of rendering them-felves of Service to the Public, have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Proclamation; and We do hereby promife and declare, that in cafe any Perfon or Perfons not fhanding charged with the Crime of wilful Murder, nor liable to be fo charged, who has or have incurred any Penalties, in, by, or for the clandeftine import-ing, running, landing, relanding, unfhipping, con-cealing, or receiving, or being affifting in fuch run-ning, landing, relauding, or unfhipping any pro-hibited Goods, Wares. or Merchandizes, or any Goods liable to the l'ayment of the Duties, under the Management of the Commissioners of Customs or Excife, or who have beat abufed, obstructed, or hindered any Officer or Officers of the faid Revenues in the due Execution of their Duty, or by Reason or Means, or on Account of any such Offences as aforefaid, or who are under any Profecutions, Judgment, Outlawry, or under, or fubject to any Execution, for any of the faid Offences, and who are at this Time gone beyond Sea to avoid the fame, shall, on or before the First Day of September hext, return to Our Kingdom of Great Britain, and shall furrender himfelf or themfelves unto the Collector or Comptroller of Our Cuftoms, in any of the Ports of Great Britain, and shall enter into Bond to Us, Our Heirs, and Successors, with One fuf-ficient Surety, to be approved by such faid Col-

lector or Comptroller as aforefaid, in the Amount of any Sum or Sums of Money with which he or they may stand charged for his or their good Behaviour; and that he or they will not in future be concerned. in any illegal Practice against Our Revenue; and further, that he or they will not depart from Our King-. dom of Great Britain during the Continuance of War, without Our Leave for that Purpole first had and obtained; all and every fuch Perfon or Perfone fo returning and furrendering himfelf or themfelves, and entering into Bond as aforefaid, upon Certifi-cate thereof from the faid Officers of Our Cuftoms, which Certificate Our faid Officers respectively are hereby required to make out and grant, to be by fuch Perfon or Perfons entering into fuch Bond produced or transmitted by fuch Officers to Our Office of Cultoms or Excile in London refpectively, as the Cafe may be, to be there registered and kept, fhall have Our gracious Pardon, of, and for all and every fuch Offence and Offences and Penalties, and all Indictments, Informations, Profecutions, Convictions, Judgments, Executions, and Outlawries fued, incurred, had or given, or that may arife or accrue, for, or by Reason or Means of any of the faid Offences, or other Matters or Things aforefaid ; and fuch Certificate fo registered as aforefaid, or a Copy thereof duly authenticated, shall be deemed and taken as Evidence in all Cafes that fuch Perfon or Perfons has or have complied in every Refpect with the Conditions of this Our Proclamation.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentieth Day of July One thoufand eight hundred and three, in the Forty-third Year of Our Reign. GOD fave the KING.
