Hammermon, Bokers, Clovers, Wrights, Taylors, Shoemakers, Flefhers, and Weavers, incorporated by Royal Charter, think ourfelves called upon in the prefent Situation of public Affairs, to approach your Majefty's Throne with united Affurances of our Attachment to your Perfon and Government, and Reverence for our happy and glorious Conflitution.

Permit us to affure your Majefty, that we view with Indignation and Albhorrence the late Proceedings of the French Government.
