To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

The Address of the Grand Jury of the City of Coventry, and County of the same.

*May it please your Majesty,*

**W**E, your Majesty's loyal and faithful Subjects, the Jurors for the City of Coventry, and County of the same, assembled at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said City and County, beg Leave to approach your Majesty in the present Situation of public Affairs, to express our Loyalty and Affection to your Majesty's Person and Government.

Truly sensible of the many Blessings we enjoy under your Majesty, and our excellent Constitution, we pledge ourselves in the most sacred Manner to exert all our Influence and Ability to support the Person of your Majesty, and the Government under which we live, in every possible Way, against the malicious Designs of the Enemies of your Majesty and our Country.

We sincerely pray that your Majesty may long continue to sway the Sceptre of these Realms, and reign in the Hearts of a free and happy People.

The humble Address of the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Community of the City of Coventry, in Council assembled.

*May it please your Majesty,*

**W**E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Mayor, Bailiffs, and Community of the City of Coventry, in Council assembled, beg Leave to approach your Majesty's Throne, and to renew, at this important Crisis, those Sentiments of Zeal and Fidelity which we have uniformly possessed

for the sacred Person of your Majesty, and for your Majesty's Crown and Government.

Convinced that the Enemy, against which your Majesty is now impelled to act, have in Contemplation the Subversion and Overthrow of the mild and equitable Government of your Majesty, and the inestimable Constitution under which we live, we humbly beg Leave to return your Majesty our grateful Thanks for the decisive and dignified Measures adopted by your Majesty, which are eminently calculated to convince our inveterate Foe that the Independence of this Country cannot be shaken.

Impressed with the fullest Conviction that the inestimable Blessings we, in common with your Majesty's other faithful Subjects, enjoy under the mild and paternal Rule of your Majesty, we most solemnly pledge ourselves to resist, by every Means in our Power, the Aggressions of the most inveterate and unprincipled Foe a civilized Country ever had to encounter, and in this we have no Doubt we shall be unanimously assisted by the Subjects of your Majesty's whole Empire.

That Divine Providence may succeed your Majesty's Zeal and Exertions for the Welfare of your People, and that your Majesty's Life may long be preserved as a Blessing to your United Kingdom, is our sincere and fervent Prayer.
