Truly fenfible of the many Bleffings we enjoy under your Majesty, and our excellent Constitution, we pledge ourselves in the most sacred Manner to exert all our Influence and Ability to support the Person of your Majesty, and the Government under which we live, in every possible Way, against the malicious Designs of the Enemies of your Majesty and our Country.

We fincerely pray that your Majesty may long continue to sway the Sceptre of these Realms, and reign in the Flearts of a free and happy People.
