Medrid, Odob, 31. From Cadiz of the 20th Inflant we have an account. That the Moors before Tangler had raifed three Batteries against the Town, · two of two Guns each, and a third of one Gun, and Charthey were undermining Pole-Fort, whichthe English had rebuilt; That the 200 Spanish Horse were at Tariffa ready to Embark for Tangier;

and that Sir Palmes Fairborne had presented the Com? mander of those Troops with a rich Sword and Belt, and had sent 500 Pieces of Eight to be distributed among the Soldiers. From Malaga of the 22 th y tell us, That Sir Fohn Berry in the Leopard, the Forefight, and four rich Merchant Ships, arrived there the 16th from Smirna; and that the Sunday before a French Vessel arrived there from without the streights mouth, who reported, That passing on the 19th near Tangiet, they heard very much shootings which made them conclude that the English and the Moors were in action. From Alicant of the 14th they tell us, that Captain Story in the Antelope was arrived there with feveral hips under his Conyoy from Cadiz bound for Italy.

There are lately arrived Letters from the Emperors Resident at Constantinople which give an account, as we are informed, That the Grand Vizier had acquainted him that the Grand Signior was willing to renew thePeace between the two Empires for 12 years longer, but that the Grand Signior would referve to himself a liberty to affift the Hungarian Malecontents, whenever he thought fit, which we may be Confident the Emperor will ne-

Heydelberg, Off. 23. Several Complaints have been made to our Elector of the Proceedings of the French viz. That on the 15th Inflant several I-rench Horsemen came to Kirchberg, and demanded to be received into the Town, and because they were not, for that they had no Letters of Health, committed feveral insolencies in the Neighborhood. That the French have Summoned Spanheim, Naumburg, and Schwarzerden, to send Deputies to Metz to do Homage to. the French King, on pretence that those places are Dependencies of the Country of Valdentz; That 100 of the French Kings Guards arrived some days since at Lautereck, having orders to Summon that place, Bingen, Franckenthal. Wormer and other places on this fide the Rhine likewise to send Deputies to do Homage; That the Inhabitants of Hokenfulzen have been required to appear by some persons appointed on their behalf, on the 25th Inflant, before the French Commillioners at Winweiller, in order, as is imagined to Swear Fealty to the French King; That the Gover-nor of Weiffenburg has fent an Order of the Royal Chamber at Brifac to the Electors Officers in the Bailage of Germersheim, by which they are required to do Homage as aforelaid in a Monthstime; That the Tenth of Wine in the faid Baillage, belonging to his Electoral Highness, is Seized by the French, which they pretend they will only detain till the differences between their King and his Electoral Highness be adjusted, but we have reason to believe that so foon as the Wine is ready they will carry it away, as they have done in the Baillage of Landecken by order of the Governor of Weiffenburg ! And it is faid that the Prench have Orders to take the Caltle of Couzensberg, near Creutzenach, and if any relistance be made, to burn the Town.
