Lambs, and Swine; Beef, Pork, Mutton, Veal, and Lamb, whether falted or otherwife; Bacon, Hams, Tongues, Butter, Cheefe, Potatoes, Sago, Sago-Powder, Tapioca, Vermicelli, Millet-Seed, Poultry, Fowls, Eggs, Game, and Sour Crout, in any British Ship or Vessel, or in any other Ship or Vessel belonging to Persons of any Kingdom or State in Amity with His Majesty, and navigated in any Manner whatever, without Payment of any Duty whatsoever; provided that a due Entry shall be made of all such Articles as aforesaid, that shall be so imported, with the proper Ossicer of the Customs at the Port where the same shall be imported, under the Penalties and Forseitures in the said Acts mentioned.

And the Right Honorable the Lords Commiffioners of His Majetty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
