1st. For regulating and managing the Concerns of this populous and increasing Parish, so far as may relate to the Prevention and Relief of the Distress occasioned by Sickness, Poverty, and Old Age, and for the due Provision of the Parish Clergy:

4th. For establishing and carrying into Effect such Regulations as may be deemed expedient for preventing the Danger arising from Fire in the said Parish; and providing such Means as may most early and effectually extinguish such Fires as may happen therein.
