

Retreat into Calais, but also for bringing all the Boats on board in Safety after the Service was performed.

The Luggers went on Shore about Half a Mile to the Westward of Gravelines; Lieutenant Starck anchored the Millbrook within Musket-Shot of her, and in the Evening a heavy Fire was opened upon her from the Shore with some Field Pieces, which, however, did no Sort of Damage, and I am happy to say, that on our Side not a Man was hurt.

I flatter myself, Sir, that the Conduct of the Officers and Men employed on this Service will meet with your Approbation.
