The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased by His Order in Council, of the Twenty-fixth of October last, to declare, in pursuance of the Act therein recited, that an infectious Distemper at that Time raging at New York, was of the Nature of the Plague; and did therefore, in pursuance of the same Act direct, That all Ships, Vessels, Perfons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes then arrived, or which might thereafter arrive in any of the Ports of Great Britain, or the Islands of Guernfey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from New York, or any Port within the State of New York, and should have cleared out from New York, or any Port within the State of New York, subsequent to the Fifteenth Day of August last, should perform a Quarantine of Fourteen Days at the fe-veral Places appointed, and according to the Rules prescribed by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-ninth of July One thousand eight hundred: And whereas His Majesty has received Information, that the faid Infectious Distemper so raging in the City of New York, hath extended itself to the City of Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, and to Alexandria, in the State of Virginia; His Majesty by and with the Advice of His Privy Majetty by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth thereupon order, that the Quarantine at present subsisting upon all Ships and Vessels coming from New York, or from any Port within the State of New York, be extended to all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes coming from the City of Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennsylvania, or from Alexandria, or any Port within the State of Virginia, and which shall have cleared out from any of the faid which shall have cleared out from any of the said Ports subsequent to the Sixth Day of September last; and His Majesly, with the Advice aforesaid, doth hereby further order, require, and command, That all Ships and Vessels whatsoever, coming from the City of Philadelphia, or any Port within the State of Pennsylvania, or from Alexandria, or any Port within the State of Virginia, and all Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes on board the same, that are aland Merchandizes on board the same, that are al- Lieutenant Hawkins, in the Six-oared Cutter, and

ready arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, do make their Quarantine for Fourteen Days, and do strictly conform themselves in all Respects to the Rules and Regulations now in force, and required to be observed by His Majesty's faid recited Order in Council, bearing Date the Twenty-sixth Day of October last: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Ossee of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Posts, the Master Capacil and the Posts. the Cinque Ports, the Master General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Ma-jesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the faid Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. I BEG Leave to inform you, in Obedience to your Signal to chase last Evening, that Part of the Convoy, consisting of Two Ketches, and One Brig, that were running under the Point of St. Guildas, I tacked and sloop after them in the Sloop I command, and obliged them to run on Shore off the Mouth of the River of Pennerf, and having confidered it very possible to cut them out in the Night, as the Wind was directly off Shore, I dispatched
