THE Hereas it hath been humbly reprefented to the King, that in the Night of Thurfilay the 22d of December that in the Night of I burgary the 22a of Lieconver-laft, about Ten o' Clock, the Report of feveral Guns was heard in a Wood belonging to and near the Houfe of Francis Ferrand Foljambe, F.fg; of Ofberton, in the County of Nottingham, subcreupon William Hall his Gamekeeper, and feveral others of his Servants, count out to endeavour to apprehend the Offenders, and having purfued them from the Wood where the Report was firlt heard to another at fome Diftance, they all (except William Holmes, one of the Scrwants of Mr. Foljambe, who was on Horfeback) entered the Wood, and in the Middle of it found one William Atkins armed with a Gun, which he prefented, threatening to blow out the Brains of the first that came near him; and it was not till after confiderable Refiftance Atkins was fecured : And whereas during the Struggle with Atkins the Report of another Gun was beard on the Outfide of the Wood, and immediately afterwards a Cry as of a Perfon in Agony, and thereupon feweral of the Servants of the faid Francis Ferrand Faljande, Efg; can to the Spot, aud found there the faid William Holmes lying on the Ground dangeroufly wounded; and the faid William Holmes bath deposed, that feeing two Men, one in a Blue Jacket, the other in a Smock-Frock, he rode up to the Man in a Jacket, and endeavoured to fecure him, on which the Man, immediately fired at him, and then, with South and William Thornton baving been feen in Com-pany with Atkins on the Evening of the Commission of this atrocious Qutrage in the Drefs defined by William Holmes ; and it appearing that the faid William Thora-ton that Evening bought Powder and Shot at Retford ; and neither Smith nor Thornton having fince been feen or b. ard of in the Neighbourhood where they refided, ftrongly authorize the Sufficien that they were Parties in the Perpetration of the Atrocity;

His Majelly, therefore, for the better and more speedily apprehending and bringing to Justice the Perfous conceined in the above Ourrage, is hereby pleased to promife His most gracious Pardon to any One of the faid Offenders (except the Perfon who actually fired the Gun, and wounded the faid William Holmes) who shall make fuch Discovery of his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, as that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
