THIS Day the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Royal Marine Forces while on Shore.

An Act to continue, until Three Months after any Restriction imposed by any Act of the present Session of Parliament on the Bank of England, from issuing Cash in Payment shall cease, an Act made in the Parliament of Ireland in the Thirty-seventh Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for confirming and continuing the Restrictions on Payments in Cash by the Bank of Ireland; and also an Act, made in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for amending the said Act.

An Act to enable His Majesty to grant the Inheritance in Fee-Simple of certain Manors, Messuages, Lands, and Hereditaments in the Parishes of Byfleet, Weybridge, Walton, Walton Leigh, and Chertsey, in the County of Surrey, to His Royal Highness Frederick Duke of York and Albany for a valuable Consideration.

An Act to indemnify all Persons who have been concerned in issuing or carrying into Execution an Order of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for permitting the Exportation of Seed Corn to Portugal from Great Britain.

An Act for allowing Vessels employed in the Greenland Whale Fishery, and clearing out from any Port in Great Britain, to complete their full Number of Men at certain Ports for the present Season.

An Act for further continuing, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and six, an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty for rendering the Payment of Creditors more equal and expeditious in Scotland.

An Act for raising a further Sum of Money for carrying into execution an Act passed in the Fortieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for making Wet Docks, Basons, Cuts, and other Works for the greater Accommodation and Security of Shipping, Commerce, and Revenue, within the Port of London.

An Act for keeping in Repair the Roads leading from Saint Dunstan's Cross to North Lane, near to the City of Canterbury, and to the Sea Side at Whitstable, in the County of Kent.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts passed in the Fourth and Twenty-fourth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, for repairing and widening the Road from Bramcote Odd House, in the County of Nottingham, to the Cross Post upon Smalley Common, in the County of Derby, and other Roads therein mentioned.

An Act to continue and amend an Act passed in the Twentieth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from the Trent-Bridge, in the County of the Town of Nottingham, to Cote's-Bridge, in the County of Leicester.
